ABOUT IEA

The Indian Economic Association (IEA), founded in 1917, is the country's oldest social sciences association. The IEA was established through the pioneering efforts of Professors C.J. Hamilton and Herbert Stanley Jevons, who were tasked with organizing research and delivering lectures in Economic Science at the University of Calcutta and the University of Allahabad, respectively.

Since 1918, the IEA has organized annual conferences without significant interruption. These conferences serve as a crucial platform for economics professionals, academics, scholars, and policymakers to debate and discuss themes of current relevance. Beyond the annual conference, the IEA also organizes refresher courses, seminars, and international roundtables, often with the support of the International Economic Association. Notably, the IEA hosted the World Economic Congress in New Delhi in 1986, under the presidency of Prof. Amartya Sen.

A distinguished list of economists, including Nobel laureate Prof. Amartya Sen, former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, and many others, has helmed the association. This lineage of leadership has cemented the IEA's role in shaping economic discourse in India.

In 1946, the IEA launched its prestigious journal, the Indian Economic Journal, which Sage Publishing now publishes. The association also releases a news bulletin detailing its activities.

The IEA's primary aim is to promote the discipline of Economics through enhanced professional competence in teaching, training, research, and consultancy. Its role has become even more critical today as India navigates geopolitical and economic uncertainties while striving to become a developed economy by 2047. The IEA's fraternity of economists provides crucial analysis and policy recommendations to help steer the country toward a prosperous future.

The association has hosted 107 annual conferences to date, held mostly in December each year.

GUIDELINES OF PAPER SUBMISSION

1. Submit the full paper in following format:

- Abstract
- Introduction
- Review of Literature
- Objective
- Methodology
- Result and discussion
- Findings
- Conclusion
- References

2. The contributions typed in MS Word, font size 12 New Times Roman at 100%, line space 1.5, and within

5000-7000 Words, including tables, graphs, figures, references, and notes, should be sent by email as an attachment.

3. The title page must carry the correspondence address and institutional affiliation of the author/authors; their contact details, including email ID.

4. The article must be accompanied by an abstract of not more than 300 words, and must reflect the scope, framework and major findings of the chosen theme.

5. The manuscript must be meticulously and minutely vetted and proofread for language and expression

accuracy; grammatical and typographical errors; aptness of the stylised equations and symbols, etc.

6. All footnotes/notes must appear at the end of the main text, followed by tables and references.

7. Notes and tables must be numbered using Arabic numerals. The explanatory note about the table/data therein, as well as the source of the table and data, must appear below the table itself.

8. Any reference within the text must be shown in bracket with surname of the author, or a source, along with the year of publication, e.g. (Government of India, 2023), or (Chadha, 2022); or Romar (1991).
9. All the papers should check plagiarism through a software and the certificate of the same should be attached along with the papers failing which the paper will not be accepted.
10. All manuscripts must be accompanied by an undertaking that the paper has not been simultaneously submitted for publication elsewhere. It also must carry a disclaimer to any plagiarism or a challenge to copyright violation by the author. In other words, an undertaking about the originality of the text and explanations used. Any quotation of an idea or a statement from other works must be duly referred.
