GUIDELINES OF PAPER SUBMISSION

1. "Title of the paper" shall be in caps except articles and prepositions like a, an, the, of, in, etc. Title of the paper to be followed by the name of the author(s), institutional affiliation, designation, mobile no., mail id and postal address. Except the name these details should be put at the bottom of the first page. That is, after the name of author, designation, institutional affiliation, mobile, email id and Postal address, this should come at the bottom of first page.
2. Abstract should not exceed 400 words with 5 to 7 Key words, and the full paper should lie between 4000-10,000 words.
3. Citation- In the text Harvard citation style should be followed as (W.W., 1964). The similar pattern of citation should be followed in the references and references should be arranged alphabetically.
4. Font size should be 12. It should be 1 inch from left side, 1 inch from right side and 1 inch from the top of full paper
.
5. The papers should be typed in single space and comprised of the following: **a)** Introduction which should be explained in the nature and the importance of the study, its scope with theoretical or historical or Policy related context of the problem. It must be followed by **b)** research questions, **c)** sources of data in case of empirical papers, **d)** methods and models, **e)** discussion of empirical results, **f)** findings and conclusions, **g)** references which should come at the end findings and all the notes including thanks etc.
In the text, the notes may be indicated by Arabic numerals and superscript and the same order should be followed till the explanation of the text after the conclusions and findings but before the references. References should be the final part of the Paper.

- Abstracts (300 words) due by September 30th, 2025
- Full paper for Conference presentation (5,000-7,000 words) due by October 31st, 2025
- For publication of Paper in Journal due date 31st March 2026

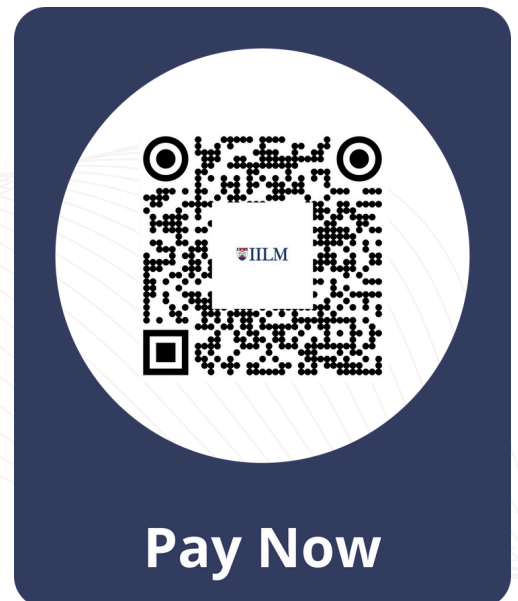

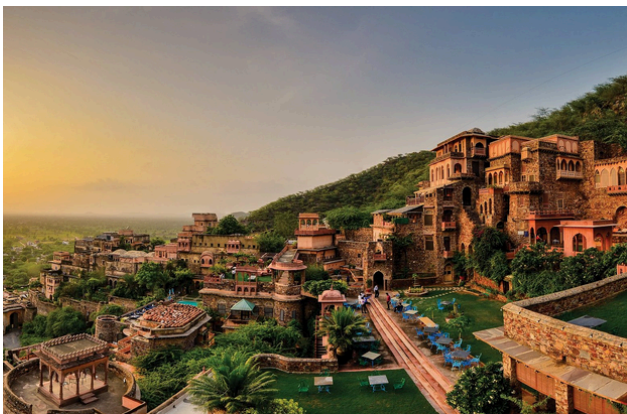

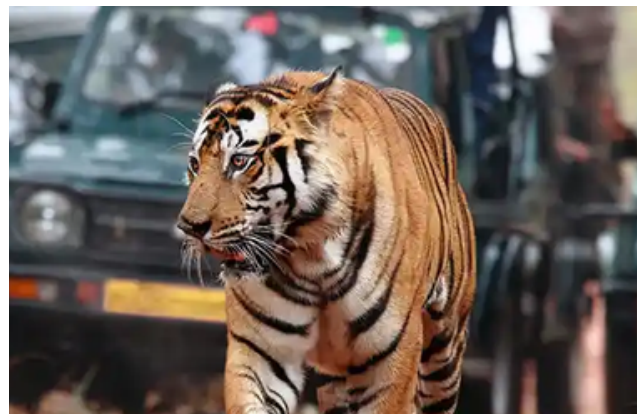
